Message From the President and Executive Director

We are pleased to report that Meals on Wheels ("MOW") continued to fulfil its theme, "Feeding Independent Living", through the challenges of the pandemic. We adapted to changes in availability of volunteers and staff and focussed on continuity of service, with volunteers and staff being vaccinated and following safety protocols.

Even as Winnipeg and the rest of the world gradually emerge from the pandemic, we continue to see its effects. In cities, dramatic changes in how people work are bringing new patterns. The higher number of employees working from home means residential neighbourhoods are more populated throughout the day. Neighbours are potentially able to play a greater role in looking out for each other. This could supplement the services of MOW, allowing more people to age in their homes, and benefitting themselves and society generally.

MOW consists of more than 200 dedicated volunteers and a small, hardworking staff. Together, they bring regular, friendly delivery of meals to people whose independent living depends on them. Volunteer numbers shrank during the pandemic, and we are now working to restore this.

Regarding administration, in 2022 we renewed our office lease at 174 Hargrave St. for five years with the rent unchanged, and an outdated volunteer/client software system is being replaced.

Volunteer Coordinator Gemma Eko-Davis retired in March after 25 years of valuable service and commitment to both our dedicated volunteers and the clients they serve. We welcome our new Volunteer Coordinator, Adam Rout.

Some directors will not be continuing after the Annual General Meeting. We are grateful to Chelsea Cockerill, Frank Lavitt, and Felicia Wiltshire, each of whom brought important skills to the Board. We wish them every success in their future endeavours.

We are grateful for the support of Boeing Operations Canada and Audi Winnipeg, our Adopt-a-Route sponsors, for allowing their employees to deliver meals during their work hours.

The Winnipeg Regional Health Authority and United Way of Winnipeg are key funding partners of Meals on Wheels Winnipeg, and we continue to be grateful for their ongoing support. We also receive donations from individuals. Every expression of support is much appreciated.

Message From the Treasurer

The summary financial statements of Meals on Wheels of Winnipeg Inc. ("MOW") for 2022, as approved by the Board of Directors, are enclosed in this Annual Report.

The 2022 fiscal year was a period of recovery, following a year that was highly impacted by COVID. Inflation rates continued to rise in 2022 and limited supply hindered the output for regular dinners which resulted in an overall drop on the number of meals delivered (3.07% decrease when compared to prior year and 2.21% below the 2022 budget). Even with the economic challenges faced in 2022, MOW maintained our commitment to the community and the clients who rely on us for their daily meals. The efforts of amazing volunteers and the dedicated team at MOW provided 167,923 delivered meals to customers during 2022. Furthermore, through generous donations from volunteers and local organizations, and controlling operating costs, MOW recorded a small surplus of net revenues over expenses for the fiscal year. Consistent with prior years, MOW is well positioned to provide affordable, nutritious, and timely meals to our local community.

In 2012, a reserve fund was established by our Board of Directors to reduce financial risk and to provide MOW with the ability to deal with unexpected changes in expenses and revenue. With the economic fluctuations including inflation and rising interest rates, there were growing uncertainties over funding for businesses in 2022 and beyond. I am pleased to report that we were able to maintain the reserve fund at a consistent level with that of 2021.

As in 2021, MOW held excess cash in short-term and long-term investments to earn interest income. The investment strategy was implemented to protect the cash balance and offset financial risk relative to market fluctuations. Following the approval of a new investment policy at the Annual General Meeting held on May 25, 2022, MOW engaged a large, bank-owned investment firm to provide portfolio management services for a balanced investment strategy, to protect the purchasing power of the portfolio over the longer term.

I wish to add my thanks to those of our President and Executive Director for our principal funding agencies, the Winnipeg Regional Health Authority, and United Way of Winnipeg, and for our numerous volunteers who so graciously continue to support the community. Without your support, MOW would not exist. Thank you! We look forward to your continued support.
